



Home-School Remote Learning Agreement

Hill Farm is determined to keep all of our pupils on-track this year and make sure no one falls behind if they need to learn from home because of coronavirus. This agreement sets out what our school staff, students, parents and carers agree to do to support remote learning related to Covid-19. The overall aim of the whole school community is to ensure continuity in learning in scenarios where pupils maybe unable to attend school.

In the event of learning moving online:

Parent/Carer If your child has to self-isolate because of coronavirus or if there's a local lockdown and the school is advised to partially close or your child has to shield we want to make sure your child can continue to learn whilst at home. The following new guidelines cover our ideal expectations of what we'd like your child to do while learning remotely, and how we plan to support you and them. Support my child in accessing online learning through Firefly. Encourage my child to complete all of the daily maths, English and theme work set. Inform the school of any issues relating to completing remote learning.	Provide remote learning that allows your child to access as much of the curriculum as possible Communicate clearly with parents/carers when remote learning needs to take place.	Complete any work that my teacher has set for me to the best of my ability. Tell my teacher if I am finding remote learning difficult. Use what I have learnt in school to keep myself safe online and tell an adult if I am ever worried.

<p>Wherever possible, provide suitable time and space for my child to complete remote learning.</p> <p>Make sure my child is accessing online resources safely and submitting work appropriately.</p> <p>Designate a working space if possible, and at the end of the day have a clear cut-off to signal school time is over</p> <p>Create and stick to a routine, as this is what your child is used to at school. For example, eat breakfast at the same time each morning and make sure they're dressed before starting the 'school' day</p> <p>Make time for exercise and breaks throughout the day to keep your child active</p> <p><i>It's important that your child engages with home learning. If for any reason they are not completing the work set, we will use the following strategies to provide additional support:</i></p> <p><i>Class teacher or a member of the Hill Farm inclusion team will call home to establish what further support can be offered.</i></p>	<p>Offer suggested timetables to support home learning routines.</p> <p>Ensure that parents/carers and pupils are familiar with and able to log in to Firefly as an online learning platform.</p> <p>Ensure that work is provided that aligns to the school's curriculum.</p> <p>Ensure that work provided is appropriate to the individual needs and learning stages of pupil.</p> <p>Provide timely feedback to work submitted by pupil.</p> <p>Respond in a timely fashion to any communication from parents or carers.</p> <p>Make alternative arrangements if your child can't access remote learning</p> <p>Provide free school meals to eligible pupils through the provision of food parcels.</p> <p>Keep in touch about developments in school through notices, newsletters, text, email and the school website.</p> <p>Follow all guidelines relating to online data protection and the safeguarding of pupils.</p> <p><i>Teachers or a member of the inclusion team will contact identified families on a weekly basis to offer additional support.</i></p>
